

Lyric and pop soprano, Marianne Lee Patterson began performing extensively during her secondary school education in the United States.

During college, a local concert organizer who tapped her for an ongoing role in the celebrated Cathedral Concert Series at the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist, noticed her. Marianne was featured for over 20 seasons with the Concert Series during which she interpreted both classical and contemporary pieces.

In June 2008, Marianne returned to the United State with her husband; Richard and three children; Marina, Richard, and Meredith. Since then she has welcomed son-in-laws Kevin and George and daughter-in-law Kerilyn. Marianne is the proud "Gramma" of Ethan, Madeline, Richard, MacKenzie and Morgan.

Starting in 2013 Marianne teamed up with local performance accompanist, Susan Anthony-Klein. Together the duet has done many charity concerts and has volunteered their talents at many local facilities to bring the joy of music to members of the community.

Marianne has been a solo cantor in the Catholic Church since 1992 and can currently be found at both St. Gregory the Great Church and Sacred Heart of Jesus Church in Danbury, CT.
